

Meet Larry: CitySites Urban Media

y story like so many who came to know Christ in the early 70s was a desperate desire to get out of the lifestyle of drugs and crime. Being raised in a single-parent home, I had a lot of freedom to follow the crowd. My mother was the sole provider for my sister and me, so I was on my own to follow the crowd. In high school, my crowd-pleasing lifestyle got me suspended 13 times and expelled once and I graduated only by the grace of God.

Following high school, I joined the Coast Guard, only to discover that drugs were easier to come by there than they were in civilian life. Eventually my drug addiction gave me an early discharge from military life. It was following that discharge that I was invited by a friend to go skiing in Colorado. It was an inexpensive trip because a church group from Texas was sponsoring it.

I thought it really didn't matter who was behind the trip as long as we got to ski all day. What I didn't know was that this church group held services at night, and you had to attend. Well, as you can guess, the services had an impact on my life and I decided to give Jesus a try. That was nearly 50 years ago, and I can say it was the best decision I have ever made.

My entire life changed, and instead of following after a secular radio career, I decided to work in Christian Radio. Along the way I did go back to school and pursued a theological career so I could become a pastor. Most of my pastoral years were spent in the inner city working among the poor and marginalized and I learned great lessons along the way. During the latter

part of my church career I added the element of audio production, and this grew to where I eventually left the pastorate after 28 years. My newest adventure combined my theological studies with my radio career and CitySites Urban Media was born in 2000. I have enjoyed that shift and for the past 20 years I have been creating video and audio/radio/podcast presentations for ministries and churches, and have met wonderful church/lay ministry leaders through the years.

In the past five years I have become keenly aware that much of the emphasis in many churches is not about the gospel, but about a hybrid that combines a cultural cocktail of scripture and secular postmodern thinking. This is a fancy way of saying that a false gospel has emerged. I realized that truth was being overshadowed by clever marketing and spiritual life was about success. I started to write a blog several times a week to address this pervasive attempt by the church to become culturally relevant at the cost of being


true to the gospel message.

In addition to my blog writings, I have been engaging with other Christian leaders to create podcasts for the internet that do not compromise the truth of God's word.

Someone asked me the other day if I was going to retire soon, and I said never! As long as I have breath

in my body with a brain to think and a heart to believe, retirement is not in the foreseeable future. My wife Paulette and I have been married 38 years, with 5 kids, 11 grandkids, an old home, and one motorcycle for me. Life couldn't be any better.

Are you feeling anxious and overwhelmed?

nxiety, worry, and stress are all a part of most people's life today. But simply experiencing anxiety or stress in and of itself does not mean you need to get professional help or you have an anxiety disorder. In fact, anxiety is a necessary warning signal of a dangerous or difficult situation. Without anxiety, we would have no way of anticipating difficulties ahead and preparing for them.

Anxiety and its partner, worry, are specific forms of fear. Worry becomes a problem when we believe the big life that "if only I worry enough about this, it will be ok."

Anxiety is my mind thinking, "this is going to hurt." I don't believe that the simplistic statement that all you need is faith, is a solution to anxiety. No one in the Bible is said to have had more faith than Job, yet this faith hero once said:

"When I lie down, I say, when shall I arise and the night be gone? And I am full of tossing to and fro unto the dawning of the day."

-Job 7:4

Anxiety becomes a disorder when the symptoms become chronic and interfere with our daily lives and our ability to function.

Two tips for dealing successfully with fear:

Remember that courage is not having no fear at all.
Courage is feeling the fear and proceeding anyway.

One of the best ways of dealing with fear that I've found comes in the form of an acronym: FEAR is False Evidence Appearing Real.



The Cross by Chris Heeb

n 2018, the Crossroads Chapel decided to construct & display an authentic first century Roman "Tau" cross. Other than the type of wood which was not available to us, we recreated a very credible replica which is approximately 400 pounds.

The Roman execution stake which Christians call the "Cross of Christ" is the most well-known symbol in History or as I like to say, HIS-story.

Starting about 2,200 years ago, it was the most intimidating symbol of Roman power and cruelty. The so-called Tau cross was named after the 19th letter of the Greek alphabet for T. The crosses were used for approximately 200 years before Christ and 300 years afterward. This was the Divine method God chose before the foundation of the World to deliver us from our Sins. This Tree-ology is the Gospel in part as spelled out in 1st Corinthians 15:1-4. Jesus brutal death on the Tree. His burial and HIS Resurrection would eventually deliver all of Creation from the curse in the Garden.


The TAU was a 2-piece cross. The vertical piece was in the 10-12 ft range and was buried 2-3 ft. The cross beam which our Lord carried was anywhere from 80-120 pounds. The Lord's cross also had a small wooden sign called a titlist, mentioned in John 19:19-20- "Roman Governor Pilate had a sign written out and put on the cross, reading Jesus of Nazareth, king of the Jews... and it was written in Hebrew, Greek and Latin".

In Genesis 2, God created ADAM, AW-DAM, the first man. He was named after the minerals/dust of the ground called Earth/AW-DAMA. Being direct physical descendants of our great uncle Adam,

the Apostle Paul makes it clear that all of Creation was bound up with Adam's Fall which had severe physical & spiritual consequences. Our bodies became cursed by disease and death, which was first brought into the world by Adam eating from the forbidden fruit of "the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil". From a human standpoint it seemed like all hope should have been lost! What was God's plan now? HIS plan all along was to send HIS second Adam!

The second Adam was Jesus, a Divine mixture of all man & God. He was designed to reverse the curse that the first Adam brought upon all of us when he disobeyed God's will in the Garden. The Tree's fruit had no power to destroy but it was breaking God's divine will that brought the punishment. God decided that the second Adam was going to undo the curse and redeem us through nailing him to another tree and that Tree was called the Cross of Calvary.

Jesus, also the Lamb of God (John 1:29) came to redeem us by being crucified on this symbolic Tree of Good and Evil. The Apostle Peter says, "Who his own self bore our sins in his own body on the Tree, that we being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes we were healed" (I Peter 2:24).

God nullified Satan's power over us that he had won in the Garden. Satan couldn't have imagined that the second tree, the Cross, would be his undoing.

Lastly in Revelation 22 in the New Jerusalem, the third tree, the Tree of Life will heal HIS people forever.

"Lord, if you're real, get me out of here!"

hen Ruby* received a private message on social media offering her a job at a computer shop, she saw it as a way to begin a life of independence. She quickly discovered the job wasn't what she was offered.

Instead, she was trapped in the grasp of a couple who exploited her in front of strangers online who would pay for her abuse.

She was 16.

"I felt imprisoned and powerless. I cried and prayed... 'Lord, if you're real, get me out of here!'" Ruby recalls.

International Justice Mission (IJM) helped local authorities find and rescue her along with 5 other girls. The people who ran the illegal operation were sentenced to 15 years in prison.

Today, Ruby is free and safe. She has even forgiven the couple who harmed her – praying for them at the back of the courtroom after their conviction.

IJM worked to place Ruby in an aftercare home where she lives as she studies in college. She is considering pursuing a law degree with the hope of helping other girls who are trapped in similar trafficking operations.

Ruby has a new life because people prayed and gave to the work of freedom. Will you join us?

Crossroads Chapel remembers Ravi Zacharias



About 20 years ago, I had the great privilege of spending time with Ravi at Luther Seminary Chapel in St. Paul along with about 400 students. I can still remember his poise and presence. I asked him his opinion about Romans 9-II, which is Paul's dissertation on the restoration of Israel and the Jewish people in the End Times. He said it was a fascinating passage that he had never really studied but was looking forward to studying.

Ravi was an atheist from a Hindu culture until a suicide attempt changed his life. When he was 17 years old in India, he didn't take school or life seriously. He attempted suicide by swallowing poison, but he survived, and his life completely changed.

It was at an Indian hospital where he was introduced to the Bible and John 14:19 by his mother, with the words "Because I will live, you will also live." It touched Ravi so much that he committed his life to Jesus. At age 19, Ravi won a preaching contest, and his life in ministry was off to a flying start. He made it his life mission to confront skeptics peacefully.


In 1983, while speaking at a Billy Graham Evangelistic Association conference in Amsterdam, Ravi felt called toward apologetic ministry. Through grace, respect, clarity and an intellectual philosophy, Ravi gave countless speeches and wrote numerous

books answering key objections and questions about the origin, meaning and morality of Christianity.

He spent the summer of 1971 speaking to American troops in Vietnam. At one point in Vietnam, the car Ravi was traveling in broke down. One passing Jeep refused to help, but Ravi and his traveling partner ultimately got the car started. A short time later, Ravi discovered the Jeep that passed him by was riddled with bullets and all four people were dead. He saw that as a sign from God, that he was being protected from above.

What has really caught my attention is how well received he was all over the world.

In 1992, Ravi was invited to speak in the Soviet Union at the Lenin Military Academy. He also spoke at events in the United Arab Emirates, the Philippines, and Bethlehem Bible



College in Palestine, as well as Universities around the World.

And he was invited to speak to the United Nations on four different occasions!

I can't wait to spend eternity with my dear brother Ravi!



The Crossroads Chapel store









The Crossroads Chapel introduced a Christian book and gift store in 1971 when the Chapel was located near the Education Building. It was operated for many years by Gene and Donna Smith.

Early 80s to 1988

In the early 80s the Reverend Art Ramsland and his wife Pearl staffed the book and gift store. The Ramslands were instrumental in helping with the relocation of the Crossroads Chapel to our second facility, the old Quonset building on Underwood st. in 1988.

1990 to 2004

For 14 years Ron and Betty Swanson managed the book and gift store from 1990 – 2004. The selection increased in variety as the Swanson's made products available from their Christian book business, "Heart to Heart Communications".

2005 to 2013

Judy Eckback took over the store management from 2005 - 2013. Judy also operated her book business, Inspirational Resources and was able to find many unique Christian jewelry pieces from Bob Seimon Design, Dicksons and Cross Jewelry. During this time, the Chapel was relocated in 2011 to its present location on Underwood next to the KidWay.

2014 to Current

In 2014, Tom Curtis assumed the store responsibilities assisted by Liz Wieberg. Tom was a manager of a North wester Bookstore before LifeWay bought the chain.

he store product was increased by partnering with a local vendor, LifeWay Christian Stores as well as product from the ever popular Kerusso witness-wear t-shirts. In March, 2019 LifeWay Christian Store closed all its brick and mortar locations due to internet retail competition. The Chapel store lost one of its main suppliers but God knew and was

providentially preparing us for another product source— donated used items.

We put out a call to churches and individuals for donations of gently used Christian books, CDs, and movie DVDs. We were overwhelmed with the generosity of these items! During the fair, we sold thousands of donated items at a reduced rate. All sales from the bookstore were put

back into supporting the ministry.

As we continue to witness brick and mortar store locations closing, Crossroads continues to be committed to offering a 12 day, "hands-on" shopping experience during the fair. 



Facing each and new challenges

n Adult & Teen Challenge is a faith-based non-profit organization that began its journey over thirty years ago, starting from humble beginnings in a reclaimed crack house in Minneapolis. It has now grown to twelve campuses throughout the state, serving more than 4,000 clients each year.

At MnTC, our mission is to assist teens and adults in gaining freedom from chemical addictions and other life controlling problems by addressing their physical, emotional and spiritual needs. Today our programs range from telehealth and out-patient services, to residential licensed treatment, residential long-term recovery, and aftercare services. In addition to addressing substance use disorders, we provide co-occurring mental health services, offer a specialized Opioid addiction program, and provide trauma-informed care throughout our campuses.

Something that makes us unique is that we often provide care even for those without the ability to pay for services. We're able to do this thanks to generous support from church partners and individuals who come alongside us providing financial gifts. On average we raise \$1,453 per month for each client in our long-term recovery program. Research shows that 80% of those who graduate our program have the tools they need to not only stay sober, but to live fuller, happier lives. We thank God for this result.

Kallan's Story

My mom passed away when I was 5 years old, so I never really felt the love that only a mother can give. I began experimenting with alcohol and marijuana

at age 13. I tried to fill the void in my life after losing my mom with independence, popularity and rebellion. In high school, my dad was my principal, so I felt like I had to party harder than all of the other kids in order to prove myself. I started using prescription pills my freshman year of high school, which quickly led to trying heroin. I made one bad decision after another, constantly trying to feel better about myself and become numb to the lifestyle that I had created. After overdosing a number of times and watching my step-brother almost lose his life to an overdose, I realized I needed to make a change.

I came to Mn Adult & Teen Challenge in 2013. It took many months for my heart to finally soften and surrender to my need for Jesus. I'm thankful that Mn Adult & Teen Challenge gave me the tools and community I needed to find freedom. I still maintain friendships with both MnTC staff and other clients. Since graduating, I worked for MnTC for a time, which allowed me to share my story and grow my professional skills. I'm now married, working in sales and marketing for a local manufacturing company

In response to the growing need across Minnesota, we have expanded. We now have campuses in Minneapolis, Brainerd, Duluth, Rochester and Buffalo.

Kelly's Story

I started using as young girl dealing with abuse. When I began, I never realized my life would turn into an endless be search for something to cover and mask the pain. I found myself in places I never thought I'd go because that's where the next high was. I lost my sons, my family and all of

my friends and found myself homeless and living in my car. And then a pastor helped me get into MnTC.

Throughout my program, I dug into all of the hurt and guilt I had been holding onto, and with God's grace I was able to forgive myself. After graduating I have been blessed to find restoration with all three of my sons. I've been part of weddings, and have been by their sides through the happiest times of their lives. I've also been able to give back by working for MnTC for 9 years; I've just been promoted to a Lead Recovery Coach Coordinator. I've also been blessed with my 6th grandchild, with a 7th on the way. The best part is, none of my grandchildren know me as an addict but only as the praying Nana that loves them.

For everyone 2020 has been a year of unplanned surprises. As a Minneapolis non-profit, we've had to adapt to the pandemic and to the riots that occurred in our backyard. While there have been many uncertain moments, we continue to see God at work and trust in His plan. When looters and rioters were in the streets to cause chaos, the community around us came together and protected our buildings from destruction.

The need for our services has never been greater. It is because of the community around us that we have survived, grown, and can help more people than ever. Because of you, our supporters, lives are being transformed, families are being restored, and communities are being strengthened.
